# NEW VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS PRE-QUALIFICATION PROCESS

Business Entity Formation Fee and Franchise Tax Waiver





The Veteran Verification Letter is a NEW benefit removing barriers for veterans starting a new business.

Effective 1 January 2022, the benefit waives the formation fee for new 100% veteranowned business entities and relieves veteran-owned businesses of the Texas Franchise Tax for the initial 5-year period. The initial 5-year period begins on the date of formation.

All businesses must file a Franchise Tax "No Tax Due" report every year, due 15 May. If 15 May falls on a weekend or holiday, the due date is the next business day.

## QUALIFYING

Answering **YES** to each question <u>may</u> qualify the veteran(s) for the Veteran Verification Letter (VVL)

1. Will the proposed entity be 100% veteran-owned?

a. Multiple veterans may own one business to make up 100% ownership

2. Is each veteran owner **honorably discharged** from active military service, from any

branch of the United States Military, Texas National Guard, or Reserves?

3. Will the new entity form between 1 January 2022 and 31 December 2025?

38 U.S. Code 101 (18) - The term "discharge or release" includes:

A. Retirement from the active military, naval, or air service, and

B. The satisfactory completion of the period of active military, naval or air service for which a person was obligated at the time of entry into such service in the case of a person who, due to enlistment or reenlistment, was not awarded a discharge or release from such period of service at the time of such completion thereof and who, at such time, would otherwise have been eligible for the award of a discharge or release under conditions other than dishonorable.

\*Those on terminal leave from the US Military will not receive a VVL until the day after the discharge date shown on the veteran DD-214



# PRE-QUALIFICATION PROCESS

\*This process serves to verify each individual submitting documents to the Texas Veterans Commission (TVC) in accordance with <u>Section 171.0005(b)</u> of the Texas Tax Code is an Honorably Discharged Veteran of the United States Military. In determining veteran status, we refer to the following:

<u>Texas Code Sec. 434.022 (2)</u> "veteran" means a person who has served in the army, navy, air force, coast guard, or marine corps of the United States; or (2) the Texas

National Guard as defined by <u>Section 431.001. (4)</u> "Texas National Guard" means the Texas Army National Guard and the Texas Air National Guard.

<u>38 U.S. Code 101 - (2)</u> "veteran" means a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable.

<u>13 CFR 125.11</u> further states "A reservist or member of the National Guard called to Federal active duty or disabled from a disease or injury incurred or aggravated in line of duty or while in training status also qualify as a veteran."

## ELIGIBLE VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS CATEGORIES

An eligible veteran-owned business must fit into one of the three categories:

I. Veteran forming a New Qualifying Business Entity on or **after** 1 January 2022 and **before** 31 December 2025

or

II. Veteran who formed an entity between 1 January 2016 and 31 December 2019, and **did not** apply for the benefit during the effective dates (must be within 5 years to qualify) **or** 

III. Veteran who formed an entity between 1 January 2022 and 31 December 2025, and **did not** apply for the benefit during the effective dates.

## **NON-ELIGIBLE CATEGORIES**

I. Veteran who formed an entity before I January 2016:

You **do not qualify** for the benefit if you are a veteran and established a business before 1 January 2016.

II. Veteran who formed an entity between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2021: You **do not qualify** for the benefit if you are a veteran and established your business between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2021.

III. Veteran Owned Business that is a Foreign or Out of State Entity:

Whether a business entity is domestic or foreign does not depend on the location of the principal business office. Instead, it depends on where the entity was formed and what law governs its internal affairs.

If an organization was formed under, and the internal affairs are governed by, the laws of a jurisdiction **other than Texas**, the organization is a "Foreign Entity."

We often refer to **foreign entities** as **out-of-state** entities to reinforce the concept that entities formed in other U.S. states are foreign entities and entities formed outside the United States.

Foreign entities do not qualify for the benefit.

- NA Form 13038, or
- Department of Veteran Affairs Benefit Summary and Service Verification Letter (one letter generated through eBenefits)

\*Must show the branch of service, dates of service, and character of service

\*\*Those on terminal leave from the US Military will **not** receive a VVL until the day after the discharge date shown on the veteran DD-214

\*\*\*See Appendix A for examples of each form

Legal Documents:

- Marriage Certificate
- Divorce Decree
- Court Document

\*Legal documents are needed when the veteran's name differs from the discharge document.



STEP 2

### Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts

- Upon receipt of the Veteran Verification Letter from the Texas Veterans Commission, Veteran Entrepreneur Program, the veteran(s) will receive step-by-step instructions on the following two steps.
- Download and complete Form 05-904 Certification of New Veteran-Owned Business Each owner must complete their part on the form

#### **Information Needed:**

- Unique ID for each owner found on the Veteran Verification Letter from the TVC VEP
- The business entity name must match **exactly** as listed on the Certification of Formation application.

\* Failure of an exact match (capitalization/punctuation) will result in a notice of rejection

#### **STEP 3**

## **Texas Secretary of State (SOS)**

\*Step-by-step instructions on submitting this request are provided upon receipt of the Veteran Verification Letter from the VEP.

#### Required Documents for a successful submission:

- Veteran Verification Letter for each owner of the business
- Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Form 05-904
- SOS business entity formation document

#### **Reimbursement of Filing Fees:**

1. Provide TVC VEP with a Certificate of Formation

2.Completed Form 05-904

3. Business primary industry

4.Once qualifications are met as a New Veteran-Owned Business, VEP will provide instructions on requesting a filing fee refund and identification as a Veteran-Owned Business through the SOS.

#### **STEP 4**

### **Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts**

### ONLY apply to businesses NOT formed through the Texas Secretary of State

Formation of a Taxable entity **OTHER THAN** a Corporation, Limited Liability Company, Limited Partnership, Limited Liability Partnership, or Professional Association, the veteran must submit the following documents to the **Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Office:**
